Many of you have turned in hours for summer service; if anyone has not, please feel free to get some half sheets (online & in Mrs. White's room) and turn it in to one of the officers, Mrs. White, or Mrs. Tamlyn. Here are some reminders about requirements for NHS members:

Each semester has requirements and **firm** due dates:

- 5 hours of service to your school
 - Max of 3 hours per event
- 5 hours of service to your community
 - Max of 3 hours per event
- Participation in fundraiser (locker wraps and candy grams)
- Participation in Blood Drive in November and in March during the school day
- Attendance at monthly meetings (first Wednesday of each month from here on out)
- Maintain 3.20 GPA
- Living the Pillars as a role model: Scholarship, Service, Leadership, and Character

Second semester hours begin **January 19th through the last day of school EXCEPT for senior's hours which are due by May 10th as you need to fulfill requirements before receiving a stole for graduation.** Volunteer hours should be for a non-profit organization, not for a parent's workplace. Forms are to be filled out completely and be signed by someone who is in charge of the activity, not stamped with someone's signature. Three hours from each activity will be put toward NHS service; extra hours are turned into the office for graduation service requirements.



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
